### JOB DESCRIPTION

Newlands House is a new gallery inspired by the historic associations of Petworth and Sussex with great artists, writers, and designers from times past.

Running in parallel with exhibitions dedicated to modern and contemporary art, photography and design, the gallery's annual cultural programme builds on the heritage of Petworth and the town's reputation for excellence in music, literature, and antiques.

Newlands House occupies a spacious Grade II listed Georgian townhouse and adjacent coach house in Petworth, West Sussex, in the heart of the South Downs. Spanning 7,500 square feet, the building was originally built for Dr. Newlands in the 18th century and was previously occupied by an antiques and interiors shop, Augustus Brandt Antiques. Petworth boasts one of the country's largest art collections, housed in the National Trust's Petworth House and Park, and sits at the centre of Sussex's burgeoning cultural scene, spanning museums, art centres, festivals, vineyards, nature trails and stately homes.

Since opening in March 2020 with a tribute to Helmut Newton, the Newlands House Gallery has exhibited the work of some of the world's greatest artists from the 20th and 21st centuries, including Ron Arad, Joan Miró, Sean Scully, Liliane Tomasko, Julian Opie Frank Auerbach, Eve Arnold and Leonora Carrington.

We are proud to be an independent gallery which is supported by a thriving Gallery team and a team of volunteers.



We rely on our Front of House volunteers to work alongside the gallery paid staff to make a difference to each visitor who comes to visit. As the first face visitors see when they arrive, you would be selling tickets, and items in our shop, providing a warm and friendly welcome and helping visitors on their visit. This role would involve a mixture of standing and sitting at a desk, speaking to visitors, and using a digital till to make sales.

We are looking for people who can regularly volunteer, ideally one day per week. Newlands House Gallery is open 5 days a week:

Wednesday - Sunday: Weekdays 10am- 5pm Sundays and Bank Holidays: 11am- 4pm

There are two shifts available each day. Shifts are:

Wednesday - Saturday: 9:45 - 1:30pm and 1:15 - 5pm Sunday: 10:45 - 4pm

# FRONT OF HOUSE VOLUNTEER TASKS

- Welcoming visitors to the Gallery
- Selling tickets as well as items, books artworks in the shop using a till
- Keeping leaflets about the Gallery stocked and tidy
- Answering questions from visitors
- Following the Gallery's health and safety
- If willing and happy to, provide a short ten-minute talk on a particular exhibition/display
- Invigilate the gallery providing additional protection and security of the collections and objects on display
- Ensure our visitors have a safe and enjoyable visit with regards to health and safety
- Recognise and respond to the specific needs of all our visitors
- Assist with the evacuation of visitors in an emergency situation
- Inform the Duty Manager of any problems or issues
